



## Applying for Entry into Subspecialty Selection

### Subspecialty Selection Eligibility

For applicants applying to join a Subspecialty Training Program after 1 July 2017, a maximum of three applications in total may be made by any applicant to a particular Subspecialty and a maximum of four applications in total may be made across two or

## Selection Shortlisting and Interview Process

### CREI Subspecialty Selection Panel

Subspecialty Selection shortlisting and interviews are conducted by the CREI Subspecialty Selection Panel comprising of the Chair/Deputy Chair (CREI Subspecialty Committee) and a minimum of two CREI Subspecialists.

### Shortlisting Process and Scoring

- The CREI Subspecialty Selection Panel shortlist the applicants for interview, based on the Selection Criteria table. The scoring system is between 0 (criteria not met) to 3 (exceeds criteria). To be deemed eligible for interview, applicants are expected to achieve a score of 2 or more based on the Selection Criteria - Written Application (no's 1-6).
- Applicants will be contacted via email with an outcome letter shortly after shortlisting is completed. The College aims to notify all applicants approximately four weeks prior to the interview date. This should allow sufficient notice, for those successful applicants to prepare for interview.

### Interview Process and Scoring

- Applicants successful for interview, will be sent their allocated date and time for interview within their outcome letter.
- A Zoom video conferencing test session will be organised by the College approximately one week prior to interview. This test session must be at the same venue as the interview.
- At interview, applicants will be assessed and scored on their answers pertaining to the Selection Criteria CREI Subspecialty – Specific Elements (no. 7) as well as Selection Criteria (no's 1 – 6) where required.
- Applicants will be contacted, within two weeks after their interview, via email with an outcome letter.

## Eligibility to Commence Training in the CREI Subspecialty Training Program

After being deemed eligible for CREI Subspecialty training, to become a CREI Subspecialty trainee, doctors must:

- Have the FRANZCOG or have the following:
  - For those trainees who commenced the FRANZCOG Training Program during the period 1 December 2003 to 30 November 2013 they must have successfully completed all requirements of basic training in t

## Applying for Part Time Training

For trainees in the CREI Subspecialty Training Program, there may be under training.
