Selection Shortlisting and Interview Process

CU Subspecialty Selection Panel

Subspecialty Selection shortlisting and interviews are conducted by the CU Subspecialty Selection Panel comprising of the Chair/Deputy Chair (CU Subspecialty Committee) and a minimum of two CU Subspecialists.

Shortlisting Process and Scoring

- The CU Subspecialty Selection Panel shortlist the applicants for interview, based on the Selection Criteria table. The scoring system is between 0 (criteria not met) to 3 (exceeds criteria). To be

Eligibility to Commence Training in the CU Subspecialty Training Program

After being deemed eligible for CU Subspecialty training, to become a CU Subspecialty trainee, doctors must:

- Have the FRANZCOG or have the following:
 - successfully completed all requirements of Basic Training in the FRANZCOG training program as well as the FRANZCOG written and oral examinations, and Assessments of Procedural and Surgical Skills, and 46 weeks of Advanced Training
 - Current Australian Medical Registration (MBA) or Medical Council of New Zealand (MCNZ) as per Regulation C1.2.2.3.
